God you call us to be a community of prayer in which our lives are offered daily to you in trust and joy. Help us to recognise all who are baptised as sisters and brothers in Christ. Through our openness to constant conversion may your Spirit assist our growth in faith. Enable us to see the form that holiness might take in our discipleship. Assist us to know ourselves, find ourselves and give ourselves in the spirit of Christ.

We praise you for those who nurtured our faith; May we too find ways to share Good News in our day. Amen.
