### Marking the death of Queen Elizabeth II

Queen Elizabeth II has been a constant in most of our lives. While she represents part of our colonial past, she has consistently acted with wisdom, generosity, and grace during her seven plus decades as head of the Commonwealth.

For those who have been paying attention we would have recognised that she was also a fellow traveller with us in following the way of Jesus – that while she may have been Queen, she also recognised that she, like us, was a subject of the King of Kings.

I was caught-out by the grief I immediately experienced on hearing the news of the Queen's death and suspect that this response will have been shared by many.
